

Physical Activity Programs for Older People

The Centre has been successful in gaining two new grants to support older people participate in physical activity programs. The first program to be run is 'Fun and Fitness for Seniors' with more to be developed later in the year. Our Community Cooking classes are also starting this term.

These courses are both subsidized by grants to encourage participation. Blue Card Referral holders can join for only \$10. The second grant will be used by the participants of the Men's Shed program to develop a community garden on site. 
