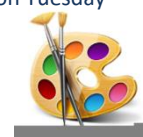
### The Art Space

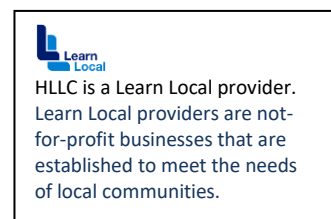
