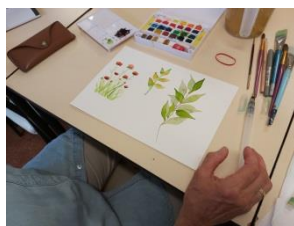

If you decide to withdraw 7 or more days prior to the workshop date HLLC will retain a 10% administration fee.
